# Public Interest Incorporated Foundation Solaputi Kids Camp Program Report for the Summer in the Fiscal Year 2020. Thank You for Your Support

We provided programs for watching closely on the situation of COVID-19 across the world, Japan and Hokkaido taking into consideration that preventing the spread of infection is the highest priority.

## 1. We sent a "small gift" to children and their families fighting their diseases who have more difficulty going out than before.

#### ♦ Wall sticker Gift

We made 500 sets of removable and repositionable wall stickers with printed animals from Hokkaido on them. We then sent them to pediatricians and pediatric hospitals all around Japan in order to make kids enjoy putting the stickers on the walls.

#### ♦ Camping at Home Gift

We sent a letter to more than 1,000 former campers and their families and asked if they would like to get camping equipment as a gift in the letter, and we sent them for those who responded yes. Those former campers stayed longer at home than usual, but at the same time, they could feel the camping atmosphere safely.

# 2. We provided the 'One Family Camp' program taking the thorough infectious disease measures. (13 times)

#### ♦ Day Camp (12 times) for families who live in Hokkaido

After the state of emergency was lifted, we provided a one day-camp program for one family total of 47 children from 12 families from the Development Support Center in Takaikawa and the Hokkaido Asahikawa General Health Care Center for Children, from June to October. The activities included horse riding, exploring the forest, and playing on the grass.

In the Fall, we invited a child with cancer, and four of his family members who live in Ibaragi, for a two-night stay at our facility. They were accompanied by his pediatrician. They tried horse-back riding, archery, campfire cooking and enjoyed the nature in Hokkaido.

### Solaputi Kids Camp 2020 Camp Plan (Summary)

We will establish our business plans for the fiscal year 2020 watching closely on the situation of COVID-19 across the world, Japan, and Hokkaido taking into consideration that preventing the spread of infection is the highest priority. (Specifically, we have developed policies as follows.)

- Cancellation, Postponement, and Change of Camp Programs
- All planed camps have been cancelled in principal. (Nine camps with four different types in summer and winter)
- We will proceed the preparation for the scheduled A Day Camp for Only One Family focusing on horse activities.
- †We will invite families (ONE family a day) and recruit volunteers (ONE volunteer a day) from our neighboring area.
- ※ If conditions permit, we will proceed the day camp program.
- Infection Prevention and Control for COVID-19 on the Campsite

We will collect the latest information from all over the world, make a manual to prevent the infection spread of COVID-19, and urge the staff and camp attendees to follow through with the manual completely.
